THE CALVES

The calves are drinking milk from the calk feeder. When the calves are bigger or if it is a sunny day, they go out in the front paddock. The calves sleep in the calf shed by the plum tree. We might need to put a gate in, so the calves can stay inside on a cold day. There's a hole in the front fence that the puppy goes through, that we need to put some netting or a gate over so that the puppy can't chase the calves. We don't want the calves to eat the agapanthuses as it will make them sick. I'll have to keep an eye on the calves and the puppy. There are 7 calves. Two calves are the same colour as a wattle flower. One is a Hereford that is black and white. The other four have patchy eyes and they are red and white. When December comes they will be out in the paddock playing by themselves and eating grass. When January comes, they will be in the paddock by the duck pond. *By Leighton*
