PRINCIPAL'S COMMENT

Student behaviour

Earlier this week I talked to all of our students about expected behaviour and in particular emphasised the impact that certain behaviours like stealing and verbal abuse can have on other students. We have staff who spend an enormous amount of time supporting students who have been the victims of this sort of behaviour and the bullies. We have students whose first response to being upset is violence. Whilst there is only a small number who behave like this, it does have a huge impact on other students and staff.

Even though these students have received lots of support, often over long periods, their behaviour sometimes does not change. In these instances we have no alternative but to stand students down.

A small number of students have been stood down in recent weeks for violence, theft and abusive language. We have talked to our students and they have all agreed that they do not want this behaviour at our school. When these behaviours are reported they will be investigated immediately and if there is sufficient evidence, a stand down will automatically follow.

School Lunches

On a much more positive note, beginning 2021 all schools will be provided free lunches. The progress on this has begun and the Ministry of Education are negotiating with a contractor at the moment who will be working with local schools. - Local people will be employed by the contractor
- The preparation and delivery of the lunches will be the responsibility of the contractor
- There will be no cost to whanau or the school
- We have had a look at a sample menu and it looks amazing
- The menu will be different on each day
- It is not compulsory
- All dietary requirements will be catered for
