MAYOR VISITS TE TIPU

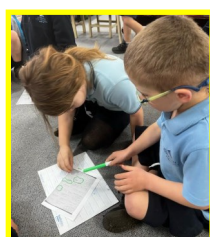
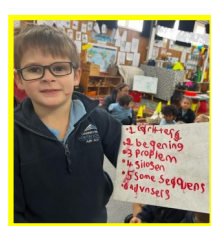
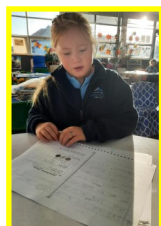
